

# ACT eyes new markets

ACT (Atria Convergence Technologies), an Optical Fiber Based Internet Technology and Internet Service Provider in the wired broadband category is evaluating high speed wi-fi networks in several states including Telangana and Karnataka. The company is also looking at connected homes with security solutions; as part of future roll outs, Bala Malladi, Group CEO of the ACT Group, told Metro India.

ACT has renamed Beam Fiber as ACT Fibernet. Malladi said parallel to this, the company is launching 100Mbps

with a downloadable limit of 200GB in the Retail segment. All the plans will be migrated from existing speeds to new higher speeds and higher data limits without any tariff change in the enterprise segment. The company which operates in Hyderabad, Bangalore and Chennai is planning to foray into other

cities, including Visakhapatnam within next three months. For entering newer markets within India, the company is exploring both internal accruals and external fund sources. It plans to take the broadband subscriber base from 6.5 lakh to 10 lakh in the next few years. Malladi ruled out entering overseas markets in near term.
